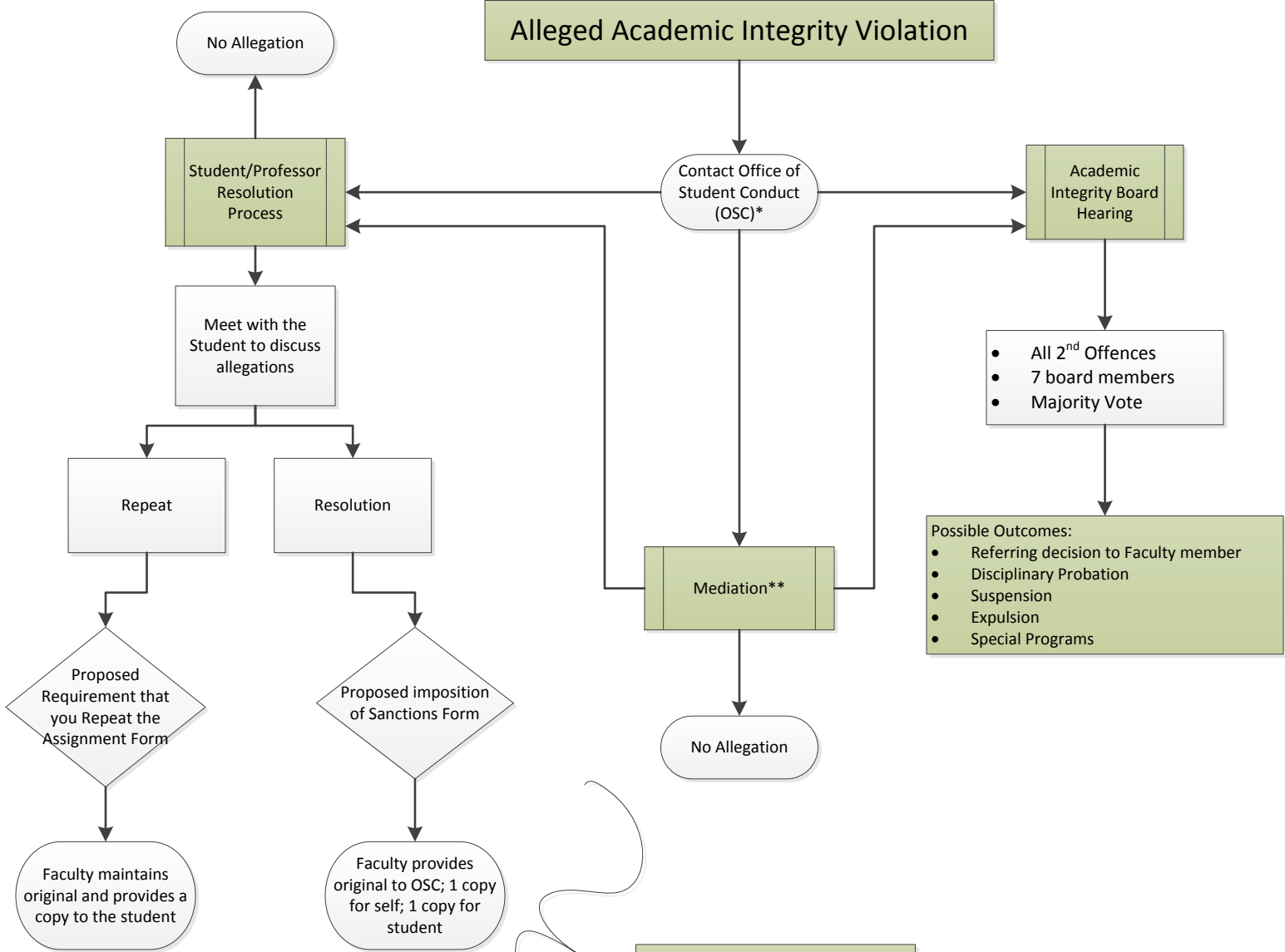


Alleged Academic Integrity Violation



*Provide the name(s) of the individual(s) involved in the alleged violation. The OSC will confirm if you are able to proceed with resolution of the incident (follow Student/Faculty Resolution) or if the incident will need to go to a board (follow Academic Integrity Board Resolution)

**Mediation is always an option and provides an opportunity for open dialogue between the student and the faculty member with the Office of Student Conduct as a neutral third party to discuss the Academic Integrity allegation and determine next steps.

PLEASE NOTE:
The OSC will explain all available options to both the student & faculty at any point during the process;

During the Student/Faculty Resolution process, if the student takes responsibility, both parties must agree to the sanctions.

If a student does not take responsibility during the Student/Faculty Resolution process, or has a second violation, the alleged violation must be heard by the Academic Integrity Board.

If an alleged violation occurs at the end of the semester, it is typical that the student would receive an "I" in the course until the alleged violation has been resolved.

Possible Outcomes:

- Reduced grade on assignment
- Reduced grade for course
- Grade of F on assignment
- Grade of F for course
- Academic Integrity Workshop
